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## Show Jumping Classes: **Grand Prix / Two Phase**

Entry Fee: \$60 per horse if competing in both events  
\$35 per horse if competing in one class only  
Includes the use of a yard on a first come first serve basis

*\*Secondary riders are welcome to ride in the Freshman class however they will be deemed to be competing HC (i.e no points will accrue toward the Northern Interschool Series or VEIS team or individual competitions)*

## Rules of Show Jumping

### “TWO PHASE” ARTICLE 274 (5.3)

A competition comprising two phases run without interruption. The finishing line for the first phase is the starting line for the second phase. There will be eight or nine fences in the first phase, and four, five or six fences in the second phase including one combination. Competitors incurring a penalty in the first phase, or exceeding the time allowed, will be halted by the bell after completing the first phase. Competitors will be placed according to penalties and time in the second phase and, if necessary, to their penalties and time in the first phase.

### “GRAND PRIX” ARTICLE 261 (5.2)

This competition is designed to encourage better jumping by making performance over obstacles the principal factor. The competition consists of two rounds, plus a Jump-Off for a limited number of riders.

#### ROUND 1

All riders take part in Round One with ten, eleven or twelve obstacles, including at least one combination. The “Time Allowed” is calculated using a speed of 275m/min for “Freshman”, 300 m/min for “Improvers”, “Progressive” and “Intermediates” and 325 m/min for “Advanced” & “Stars”. Time penalties apply if the “Time Allowed” is exceeded (1 penalty per four seconds or part thereof). The “Time Limit” is twice the “Time Allowed”. Any rider exceeding the “Time Limit” is eliminated.

#### ROUND 2

All riders, including those who were eliminated or who retired during Round One, may take part in Round Two. Riders ride the same course with the same obstacles (excepting that the number of obstacles in Round Two may be reduced to a minimum of eight) in the same draw order as for Round One, excepting that all obstacles in Round Two are raised 5cm. Time penalties again apply.

#### JUMP-OFF

All riders who have ridden two clear rounds take part in the Jump-Off, plus all others with the least number of penalties so that at least 25% of the field participate. The Jump-Off will consist of a minimum of six obstacles, including a combination. All obstacles in the Jump-Off are raised a further 5cm.



## PLACING

Riders who take part in the Jump-Off, are placed according to their aggregate penalties, including their penalties in Round One and Round Two which are carried forward into the Jump-Off, and, if on equal penalties, to their time incurred in the Jump-Off. The remaining riders are placed according to their aggregate penalties in Round One and Round Two and, if on equal penalties, to their time incurred in Round Two.

## TEAM SCORES

- Points will be awarded to 10<sup>th</sup> place
- Best 4 scores will be taken from each school

## The Northern Interschool Series 2018

Individual Champion and Reserve Champion for each section will be awarded at the conclusion of the Northern Interschool Series. All Scores count towards the final Northern Individual Championships. In case of an equal, sashes will be awarded to both parties. If a horse & rider combination has won the Northern Championship at a particular level, they are not eligible for the Northern Championship at that level in subsequent years. The exception to this is if they are at the highest level on offer, i.e. Star Level in Show jumping & Advanced Dressage. Riders can compete at the same level but will not be eligible for Northern Zone points. Riders must compete in at least two Northern SJ events to be eligible for a series award.

The Champion School Team for both Dressage and Showjumping will be awarded a Perpetual Shield/Rosette at the conclusion of the final event of the Northern Championships.

## SCORING:

Team Championships will use the following system of scoring. The best 4 scores from each school count for the School Points at each competition.

Points will be allocated on the basis of 10pts for 1st, 9 pts for 2nd and so on to 1 pt for 10th place in each championship level to a maximum possible score of 40.

# Rules of Competition

This competition is affiliated with EA. EA members must put EA numbers on entry form.

Unless your school will cover your Accident and Public Liability Insurance you must be an EA or PCAV member.

If your school does cover these insurances, a letter of proof MUST be submitted with the Entry Form.

## ELIGIBILITY

Competition open to all currently enrolled primary and secondary school students.

## CONDITIONS

- Schools must nominate a suitably experienced Team Manager. Team Managers are responsible for Gear Checks; inappropriate gear will result in elimination.

- All riders must be currently enrolled at the school they are representing and **MUST** be accompanied by an adult.
  
- All riders must wear currently approved helmets and boots whilst mounted. School equestrian uniform including white, beige fawn or banana jodhpurs must be worn in all competitions and for presentations. **NO BLAZERS/TAILORED JACKETS.**
- No riders other than those competing are allowed to ride on the grounds. ☐☐One horse, one rider rule applies. Riders may ride more than one horse.
- **LATE ENTRIES** will pay additional \$10.00 per entry, must be paid **BEFORE** rider enters ring for first class. Late Entries will also ride early.
- Events may run later or earlier than advertised riders are expected to be aware of changes to times and report accordingly. Riders who do not report in time to ride in their draw order may be eliminated.
- In the event of excessive entries, participation in the event will be based on order of receipt of entry excluding the riders of the school holding the competition.
- **SCRATCHINGS** after the Close of Entries. As per EA rules, a vet/doctor certificate is required for return of entry money less \$15.00 administration costs. The Event Secretary must be notified before the start of the class to receive a refund. For scratchings **on the day** call/SMS 0412 441 859.
- Any rider deemed to be riding in an incorrect grade will be eliminated and will be required to compete at a level deemed appropriate by the committee (after consultation with all relevant parties).
- All appeals must be lodged by the Team Manager on the official form available from the organising committee, no later than 30 minutes after the incident accompanied by \$ 50.00, which will only be refunded if the protest is upheld. All appeals will be considered by the Ground Jury appointed on the day.
- Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place in each class. Rosettes for overall Champion and Reserve for each section.
- All riders must provide own saddle cloth and bridle numbers as per draw.
- The Committee reserves the right to alter, delete any event, and refuse entry with or without a reason.
