- Please use the February 2019 EA Dressage Tests unless otherwise stated above.
- Prix St. George and Intermediate 1 (PSG and Inter 1) qualification: Horse/Rider combination must have competed at Advanced Level in 2 separate tests and have gained a minimum of 57.5% to be eligible to start in PSG and Intermediate.
- *Prix St George (PSG) and Inter 1 will be the 'Small Tour'. Championship Points will be awarded to the 'Small Tour'.
- Alternatively riders may compete in PSG and 1 Advanced, however, this combination will not gain any championship points.

The Northern Interschool Series 2019

Individual Champion and Reserve Champion for each section will be awarded at the conclusion of the Northern Interschool Series. All Scores count towards the final Northern Individual Championships. In case of an equal, sashes will be awarded to both parties. If a horse and rider combination has won the Northern Championship at a particular level, they are not eligible for the Northern Championship at that level in subsequent years. The exception to this is if they are at the highest level on offer, i.e. Star Level in Show jumping and Advanced Dressage. Riders can compete at the same level but will not be eligible for Northern Zone points. Riders must compete at both Northern series Dressage events to be eligible for a series award. The Champion School Team for both Dressage and Show Jumping will be awarded a Perpetual Shield/Rosette at the conclusion of the final event of the Northern Championships.

Scoring

Team Championships will use the following system of scoring. The best 4 scores from each school count for the School Points at each competition. Points will be allocated on the basis of 10pts for 1st, 9 pts for 2nd and so on to 1 pt for 10th place in each championship level to a maximum possible score of 40.

RULES OF COMPETITION:

Eligibility and Insurance:

- This competition is affiliated with Equestrian Australia (EA).
- This competition is open to all currently enrolled primary and secondary school students. Please supply a current EA number or PCAV number on the entry form. (PCAV book must be supplied on the day)
- Schools which will cover riders for competition must provide a letter with acknowledgment of both Personal and Public Liability. This must be sent at time of entry.

Conditions:

Important note regarding Preparatory Dressage:

Preparatory tests are for children that are in the early years of primary school and are beginners or inexperienced riders. Please do not enter these classes if the rider:

- is graded or has competed higher than PCAV 5;
- can canter confidently;
- has ever competed in jumping classes with starting height above 45cm;
- competes regularly and independently in showing classes;
- placed 1st -6th in Preparatory Dressage or a showing class at any Interschool State championship or placed 1st – 6th in any VEIS Grand Final at Preparatory Level.

Riders cannot compete in both Preparatory and Preliminary Dressage. Please note that entries will be checked for compliance.

- EA rules apply. These can be found at www.equestrian.org.au or www.vic.equestrian.org.au.
- No Stallions or Rigs are not permitted at any VEIS Interschool Competition.
- Schools must nominate a suitably experienced Team Manager. Team Managers are responsible for Gear Checks. Inappropriate gear will result in elimination.
- All riders must be currently enrolled at the school they are representing and be accompanied by an adult.
- All riders must wear currently approved EA helmets (EA Helmet rules updated 19th October 2016) and riding boots while mounted. School equestrian uniform including white, beige, fawn or banana jodhpurs must be worn in all competition and for presentations. Gloves must be worn.
- No riders other than those competing, are allowed to ride on the grounds.
- One horse, one rider rule applies. Riders may ride more than one horse.
- Entry only accepted with full payment.
- Entries after the closing date will pay an additional \$10.00 per entry, which will be paid at the time of entering. Late entries, if accepted, will be assigned where the draw allows. In the event of excessive entries, they will be considered in the order of receipt.
- Officials and marshals are to be easily identified by an orange florescent vest.
- Classes may run later or earlier than advertised. Riders are expected to be aware of changes to times and report accordingly. Riders who do not report in time to ride in their draw order may be eliminated.
- A \$10 administration fee will be deducted from all SCRATCHINGS. After closing date, as per EA rules, a vet/doctors medical certificate is required for return of entry money, less \$10 administration fee.
- Horses must be entered in their correct EA level. Any Rider deemed to be riding in an incorrect grade will be eliminated.
- All appeals must be lodged by the Team Manager on the official form available from the organising committee, no later than 30 minutes after the incident accompanied with \$50.00, which will only be refunded if the protest is upheld. All appeals will be considered by the Jury of Appeal on the day.
- All riders must provide own numbers as per the draw, and these must be worn on both sides of the bridle or saddle cloth.
- The Committee reserves the right to alter or delete any classes, and refuse entry with or without a reason.
- All riders must present at the Secretary's Office before they compete on the day.
- DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON GROUNDS. If compliance to this rule is not adhered to competitors may be eliminated and persons may be asked to leave the grounds.
