Show Jumping Class Definitions

Please note Freshman Encourage Improvers, Progressive Classes

"TWO PHASE" ARTICLE 274 (5.3)

A competition comprising two phases run without interruption. The finishing line for the first phase is the starting line for the second phase. There will be eight or nine fences in the first phase, and four, five or six fences in the second phase including one combination.

Competitors incurring a penalty in the first phase, or exceeding the time allowed, will be halted by the bell after completing the first phase. Competitors will be placed according to penalties and time in the second phase and, if necessary, to their penalties and time in the first phase.

"GRAND PRIX" ARTICLE 261 (5.2)

The competition consists of two rounds, plus a Jump-Off for a limited number of riders.

ROUND 1 All riders take part in Round One with ten, eleven or twelve obstacles, including at least one combination. The "Time Allowed" is calculated using a speed of 275m/min for "Freshman", 300 m/min for "Improvers", "Progressive" and "Intermediates" and 325 m/min for "Advanced" & "Stars". Time penalties apply if the "Time Allowed" is exceeded (1 penalty per four seconds or part thereof). The "Time Limit" is twice the "Time Allowed". Any rider exceeding the "Time Limit" is eliminated.

ROUND 2 All riders, including those who were eliminated or who retired during Round One, may take part in Round Two. Riders ride the same course with the same obstacles (excepting that the number of obstacles in Round Two may be reduced to a minimum of eight) in the same draw order as for Round One, excepting that all obstacles in Round Two are raised 5cm. Time penalties again apply.

JUMP-OFF All riders who have ridden two clear rounds take part in the Jump-Off, plus all others with the least number of penalties so that at least 25% of the field participate. The Jump-Off will consist of a minimum of six obstacles, including a combination. All obstacles in the Jump-Off are raised a further 5cm. Riders in the Jump-Off, may be asked to ride in reverse order to their aggregate penalties and, if on equal penalties, to their time incurred in Round Two.

PLACINGS Riders who take part in the Jump-Off, are placed according to their aggregate penalties, including their penalties in Round One and Round Two which are carried forward into the Jump-Off, and, if on equal penalties, to their time incurred in the Jump-Off. The remaining riders are placed according to their aggregate penalties in Round One and Round Two and, if on equal penalties, to their time incurred in Round Two.

"A2" ARTICLE 274 (5.3)

Table A class over one round against the clock. Riders jump all obstacles. Placings are according to time taken.

"GRAND PRIX" replaced with ARTICLE 273 (3.1)

COMPETITION OVER TWO ROUNDS 1. This Competition comprises, with the same speed, two courses, identical or different, either in track or in number of obstacles or in the dimensions of the obstacles. Each Athlete must participate with the same Horse. Athletes, who have been eliminated or who have retired during the first round, may not take part in the second round and may not be placed. All the Athletes go forward to the second round according to the conditions of this schedule. The second round is in reverse order of penalties in the 1st round; Athletes retain their drawn order in case of equality of penalties there is no jump-off

Rules of Competition

Eligibility and Insurance

- This competition is affiliated with Equestrian Australia (EA).
- This competition is open to all currently enrolled primary and secondary school students. A current EA number, PCAV number or letter from your school stating you are covered under their insurance, is required for insurance purposes.

Conditions

- EA Rules apply, these can be found at www.equestrian.org.au or www.vic.equestrian.org.au
- No Stallions or Rigs are permitted at any VEIS Interschool Competition.
- Schools must nominate a suitably experienced Team Manager. Team Managers are responsible for gear checks. Inappropriate gear will result in elimination.
- All riders must be currently enrolled at the school they are representing and must be accompanied by an adult.
- All riders must wear currently approved EA helmets (EA Helmet rules updated 19th October 2016) and riding boots while mounted. School equestrian uniform including white, beige, fawn or banana jodhpurs must be worn in all competition and for presentations. Jackets are permitted for Advanced and Stars.
- No riders other than those competing are allowed to ride on the grounds.
- One horse, one rider rule applies. Riders may ride more than one horse.
- Entry only accepted with full payment.
- Entries after the closing date will pay an additional \$10 per entry, which will be paid at the time of entering. Later entries will be assigned early times if accepted. In the event of excessive entries they will be considered in order of receipt.
- Classes may run later or earlier than advertised. Riders are expected to be aware of changes to times and report accordingly. Riders who do not report in time to ride in their draw order may be eliminated.
- A \$10 administration fee will be deducted from all scratching's. After closing date, as per EA rules, a vet/doctor certificate is required for return of entry money, less \$10 administration fee.
- Any rider deemed to be riding in an incorrect grade will be eliminated.
- All appeals must be lodged by the Team Manager on the official form available from the organising committee, no later than 30 minutes after the incident, accompanied by \$50, which will only be refunded if the protest is upheld. All appeals will be considered by the Jury of Appeal on the day.
- All riders must provide own numbers as per the draw, and these must be worn on both sides of the bridle or saddle cloth.
- The Committee reserves the right to alter or delete any event, and refuse entry with or without a reason.
- All riders must present at the secretary's office before they compete on the day.

Individual and Team Scores

- Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place in each class.
- Points will be allocated in the TWO-PHASE Class from 10 points for 1st down to 1 point for 10th, and in the GRAND PRIX Class from 20 points for 1st down to 2 points for 10th. Points scored in the two classes applicable to each level will be aggregated and rosettes will be awarded to the Champion and Reserve Champion in each Level (Rider must compete in both classes at their level to be eligible for the Championship). In the event of an equality of points, points earned in the Grand Prix will decide the winner.
- Best 4 scores will be taken from each school. Sash/rosette will be awarded for overall winning school team.
- In the case of equality with Team Score, the aggregate of the 4 individual Scores in the GP will be used.

Definitions

1. **School** means Geelong Grammar School including its employees, other participants of the Equestrian Centre, users and occupiers of the School grounds.
2. **School grounds** means the grounds of the School, including the Equestrian Centre and any other land or property owned, occupied or used by the School.

Agreement and authority

3. This document carries important legal obligations and is to be completed and returned to the School before undertaking any horse related activity on School grounds.
4. Horse riding is available on School grounds solely on the basis that these terms and conditions of this waiver are complied with.
5. By signing this waiver I accept all of the terms and conditions of this waiver.
6. I have the authority to give this consent on behalf of any children under my care.

Acknowledgement

7. I understand, acknowledge and agree:

7.1 Horse riding is a dangerous activity and horses can act in sudden and unpredictable (changeable) ways in any circumstance;

- 7.2 Serious INJURY or DEATH may result from horse riding activities;
- 7.3 The rider participates solely at the rider's own risk;
- 7.4 I am aware of the dangers associated with the consumption of alcohol or mind altering drugs before and during horse riding;
- 7.5 I will not drink alcohol or take drugs prohibited by law prior to or during horse riding;
- 7.6 I take full responsibility for any injury, loss or damage caused by me on School grounds;
- 7.7 I will wear a safety approved helmet and suitable clothing at all times whilst horse riding;
- 7.8 I will abide by all rules of the School, in addition to these terms and conditions for horse riding in the School grounds. I agree it is my responsibility to inform myself of such rules prior to riding and if I am in any doubt of such rules I will contact the person who is in charge of the Centre from time to time;
- 7.9 I agree that I will not behave in a way that is likely to endanger myself or my fellow riders;
- 7.10 I will follow all directions of my instructor, supervisor or any other employee of the School, and agree that any misconduct or refusal by me to follow such directions may result in the immediate removal of my horse and me from School grounds; and
- 7.11 Where the rider is under the age of 18 years I warrant to the School that the rider will comply with all terms and conditions of riding and it is solely on that basis that the rider will be permitted to participate in horse riding activities on School grounds.

Indemnity

8. In the event of an accident or injury arising from, or in connection with the use of the riding arena by me and/or the children under my care, I will indemnify the School for all ambulance, medical, veterinary, or other costs incurred as a result of the accident; and the School will contact the person I have nominated at the start of this waiver to be my emergency contact.

Release

9. I hereby release and hold harmless and agree not to take action against the School with respect to any and all injury, disability, death or loss or damage to person, including me and/or the children under my care, or property, whether caused by negligence of the School or otherwise.
10. I understand that my signature to this document constitutes a complete and unconditional release of all liability of the School to the greatest extent allowed by law in the event of me and/or the children under my care suffering injury or death.

Warning under the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010*

11. Under the provisions of the Australian Consumer Law (ACL) several conditions are implied into contracts for the supply of certain goods and services (ACL conditions).
12. These ACL conditions mean the School is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to you in the form of access to facilities for horse riding activities are:
 - 12.1 rendered with due care and skill; and
 - 12.2 are fit for the purpose for which they are commonly bought as is reasonable to expect in the circumstances; and
 - 12.3 are reasonably fit for any particular purpose or might reasonably be expected to achieve any result you have made known to the supplier.
13. Under section 139A of the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010*, the School is entitled to ask you to agree that the ACL conditions do not apply to you. If you sign this form, you will be agreeing that your rights to take action against the School under the ACL if you are killed or injured because the services were not rendered with due care and skill or were not reasonably fit for their purpose are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form.
14. Reckless conduct, as defined in the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010*, causing significant personal injury, is excluded from this change to your rights under the ACL conditions.
